

## **SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO**

### **ACTIVE PARISHIONER**

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

-Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**)
-Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
-Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving
(**Treasure**)

### PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

### **Infant Baptism Class for Parents**

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre-registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

### **First Holy Communion**

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

### Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

### Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

### Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

## SPIRITUAL LIFE

#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### A Reason for a Season

Everything and any activity that happens in time or season activates different reactions in all human beings and the whole creation. Regardless of our various reactions, everything and every activity will happen in its own time and season.

This applies to the seasons of our liturgical calendar. Each season has a purpose for our faith as Catholics and our growth in our relationship with God. As we know our liturgical calendar has three cycles (A, B, and C), and each cycle repeats the same liturgical seasons, but each cycle is mostly different from others

by the dedicated scriptures. Every season in our liturgical calendar is very important for our Christian life as Catholics.

The liturgical calendar of our Church sets both a rhythm and a foundation for the life of the faithful, and through its seasons, solemnities and feast days, Catholics are not just reminded, but walk through **the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ**. It is also right to say that, the seasons of a liturgical calendar also walk us through the full range of human emotions and experiences. For example, the Season of Lent, reminds us that in one way or another we are all sinners, and so it asks as to reflect on repentance and forgiveness.

Each liturgical season calls us to examine our emotions and experiences as well as to reflect on our reactions to them, and what comes within them. I believe each season in a liturgical year helps us to deal with what life hands us, and thus, how to fully function and thrive as human beings in our Catholic faith. This is true also of the **Ordinary Time**, a season which is often overlooked. The season of **Ordinary Time** calls us to adopt the ways of Jesus Christ for ourselves and to let his life become our own.

So, the question is, how are you doing with putting the messages and lessons of each season into action? For this to happen, there is a need to put emphasis of each season on preparation, rather than on the celebration. Choose and read one aspect of Jesus' life or teaching each day and take concrete steps to live the way of Jesus in your day-to-day life. **God bless You!**

## CATHOLIC APPEAL OF SOUTH CAROLINA (CASC) REPORT

The following is our 2023 parish progress report regarding our contribution to the Catholic Appeal of South Carolina as of **December 28, 2023.** Our 2023 Goal was \$88,714.00, and we exceeded our goal by 165% in the amount of \$146,435.27, with a pledge balance of \$90.00. The number of donors was 249 families out of 1,506 registered families. The parish families represent the number of households in the Office of Stewardship database of our diocese.

We are expecting to receive a rebate check of **50%** of the exceeded amount of our goal. I wish to thank you all for your prayers, participation, and generous contributions to this Mission of God in our diocese. As you may know almost all the ministries of our diocese like Catholic schools, youth ministry, diaconate and seminary formation depend on all of you and other parishes' generous donations to this annual appeal of our diocese.

It is my hope and prayer that we will again respond generously to this and every year's appeal to share our blessings with others. This in no doubt is a very noble cause. May God bless you and all that you do for His ministry.

### BREAKING NEWS FOR THOSE WHO WANT TO CONSIDER A CATHOLIC EDUCATION!

In May 2023, Gov. Henry McMaster signed the Education Scholarship Trust Fund Act (ESTF) into law. This program provides scholarships that cover the costs of the education, including private school tuition and fees, homeschool programs, textbooks and supplies, tutors, and many other services and tools approved by the South Carolina Department of Education.

Accepted applicants will be awarded up to \$6,000 per child for approved uses. This program provides parents with more freedom to choose the best options for how their children will be educated. It will assist lower-income families with school expenses and can be utilized for **Catholic school tuition**.

We are called as Catholics to make a quality, truth-centered education available in our communities. ESTFs give families in our state a unique opportunity to access education that brings children to a better knowledge of God and the world around us. <u>Applications are open from Jan. 15 to March 15</u>. Only 5,000 applications will be funded this first year (and will increase in successive years).
