

SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO

ACTIVE PARISHIONER

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

-Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**)
-Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
-Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving
(**Treasure**)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre-registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS/ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

As the Season of Lent approaches there will be some changes to some liturgical activities at our beloved parish. There will be a change of time to Fridays' Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament as we will begin the Stations of the Cross. The Stations of the Cross will start on Friday, February 16, 2024, through Friday, March 29, 2024, and the time for the Stations of the Cross will be held at 6:00 PM.

Therefore, from **Friday, February 16, 2024**, through **Friday, March 22, 2024**, the **Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament** will be held at **9:45 AM - 10:45 AM**, and from **12:00 Noon - 5:00 PM**. There will be no Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Good Friday, March 29, 2024.

One of the **three Pillars of Lent** is **Prayer**, so we have great opportunity during this Season of Lent to deepen our prayer life by attending and praying on the **Stations of the Cross** and the **Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament**. It is my hope and prayer that all of us should start planning to be part of these wonderful **spiritual reflections** and **prayer** during Lent.

PREPARATION FOR ASH WEDNESDAY

We will be observing Ash Wednesday in less than a week; that will be on February 14. One of the preparations for Ash Wednesday is to have ashes ready for this day, which marks the beginning of the Season of Lent. The ashes are of branches of either the olive tree or according to custom of the palm tree which have been blessed the previous year on Palm Sunday.

I am therefore asking all those who have dry palm branches in your homes to start bringing them back to the Church by **Monday**, **February 12**, **2024**. This will give us time to have ashes ready for this important day that opens our minds and hearts to the Lenten Season.

ASH WEDNESDAY MASS

Ash Wednesday Mass which falls on **February 14**, **2024**, will be celebrated at **11:00 AM** and **6:00 PM**. Although Ash Wednesday is not a holy day of obligation, it is a very important day on the Liturgical calendar, as it marks the beginning of the **Season of Lent**. However, Ash Wednesday is an **obligatory day** of **fasting** and **abstinence**. The **norms of fasting** in our Church are obligatory from **age 18 through age 59**.

Regarding fasting, a person is permitted to eat **one full meal**, as well as a **couple of smaller meals** at different times that together **cannot be equal to a full meal**. The **norms from abstinence** from **meat** are binding on all Catholics from the age of 14 upwards.

We are all invited and very much encouraged to attend Ash Wednesday Mass so as to move forward together into the Season of Lent.
