SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO

ACTIVE PARISHIONER

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

 -Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**)
-Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
-Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (**Treasure**)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre-registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

SPIRITUAL LIFE

FROM THE DESK OF OUR PRIEST IN RESIDENCE Fr. Emerson Rodriguez Delgado

Peace and all good my dear friends. Last week, we reflected on Saint John's account of the Lord's first appearance. He burst into the upper room and said, "Peace be with you." John connected this post-resurrection encounter with the gift of the Holy Spirit and the forgiveness of our sins, as we celebrated Divine Mercy Sunday.

This Sunday, we have another post-resurrection encounter recorded by Saint Luke. We gain a more simple and direct insight into the gift our Lord gives us. His first words to the disciples, just like last week, were "Peace be with you." Then he asked, "Why are you troubled and why do questions arise in your hearts?" It's as if our Lord desires to pose the same question in our present circumstances. Amidst all our sadness and trials, disillusionment and uncertainties, our constant solace lies in our communion with the risen Christ during the Holy Eucharist celebration.

Let us remember that the Church is not simply an institution functioning like a business entity. Rather, it is the spotless Bride of Christ, born from his side as he hung upon the cross. The Church is His mystical body, with Him as our head and the Holy Spirit as her soul. It is through the Church that we hear the call to repentance and experience the joy of our sins being forgiven.

As we approach the altar today, empowered by the Holy Spirit, we meet and welcome the same Christ who appeared in today's Gospel. He asks us as he asked them, "Why are you troubled, and why do questions arise in your hearts?" Despite life's challenges and complexities, this Easter event offers a life-changing reality for all of us, connected to us through our baptism. By keeping this event in our minds and hearts, we can put our anxieties into proper perspective. Then, each day becomes an opportunity to experience a transformative encounter with our risen Lord, filling us with his joy, peace and reconciliation. May the peace of the risen Lord, surpassing all understanding, be with you now and always.

Alleluia. Alleluia.

I know sometimes there are questions about who assists the pastor and principal as the voices of the community to be sure we are staying true to our school & parish mission. That's where the School Advisory Council (SAC) comes in! SAC is formed and guided by by-laws set forth by the Diocese of Charleston, which can sometimes be adapted (with approval from the Bishop and Superintendent of Schools) to fit the needs of each school community.

The by-laws outline the following for each schools' advisory council: purpose & function, membership, meeting requirements, officers, committees, and ethical obligations & conflicts of interest. Each monthly meeting of SAC operates on a standard agenda consisting of prayer, review of minutes from previous meeting, committee reports, principal & pastor reports.
