

SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO

ACTIVE PARISHIONER

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

 -Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**)
-Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
-Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (**Treasure**)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre-registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

SPIRITUAL LIFE

FROM THE DESK OF OUR PRIEST IN RESIDENCE Fr. Emerson Rodriguez Delgado

Life can often feel like a whirlwind, with shadows of doubt and uncertainty clouding our journey. It's natural to seek our life's purpose, both as individuals and as a community. But remember, in the midst of these heavy questions, there's a beacon of hope: Jesus's promise of abundant life. Now, the question arises, do we believe in this promise? If we do, we acknowledge our need for the Good Shepherd. He alone can fulfill our quest for purpose, love, intimacy, communion, and eternal life. He offers all of these to us willingly. Living this abundant life means staying attuned to and following our Shepherd's voice. It requires finding quiet moments to listen to Jesus's teachings in the Gospels and acknowledging His presence in the Eucharist, during prayer, in our daily lives, and within our community. The Good Shepherd calls for our friendship and intimacy. He reveals a beautiful truth: we are constantly loved by Him, never alone. As St. Paul declared, "Nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus." We are intimately tied to God through Jesus, even when we walk in the darkest valleys, we should fear no evil (Ps 23). Martin Luther King once said that it's during the darkest nights when we can see the stars more clearly. In our faith, any darkness is not of the tomb, but of the womb. It's a new birth. Think about a midwife's advice during labor: "Breathe," she advises, followed by: "Push." The creation waits eagerly for the children of God to be revealed. We hope for what we do not yet have and wait for it patiently (Rm 8:22). The Gospel brings to light our struggle to discern Jesus's voice amidst the world's noise. We're bombarded by media, the lure of power, pleasure, a need for recognition, and more. As a result, a life dedicated to service and selfless love can seem pointless. We, too often, act like sheep, moving with the crowd, influenced by people, events, and societal values. It's easy to lose sight of our faith, purpose or what truly defines us as a community. But, let's not forget that Jesus, our risen Lord, is our Good Shepherd. He calls Himself the "Gate" of life and promises a full life if we listen to His voice and enter through this Gate. This sunday, He calls upon us, the St. Anthony community to be good shepherds: to protect the vulnerable, uplift the fallen, and respond to others' needs and act as pillars of unity and resilience. This is more than a mission; it is our purpose and our identity as the St. Anthony community. Let's listen in faith, trust with our hearts, and love with our minds. This leads to abundant life. The Gate is open. Will we step in? Are we ready to embrace this challenge?

Peace and All Good, my dear friends.

PRINCIPAL'S PURVIEW

HAPPY EASTER!!

For the next few weeks I want to share a bit about our School Advisory Council in the *Purview*. I know sometimes there are questions about who assists the pastor and principal as the voices of the community to be sure we are staying true to our school & parish mission. That's where the School Advisory Council (SAC) comes in!

This week we will focus on the work of the **Advancement** & **Enrollment Committee**. This committee is co-chaired by Jamie Judge and Ruth Robertson.

The Advancement & Enrollment Committee shall provide advice, recommendations and input concerning annual and long-term fund raising activities on behalf of the School and, to the extent assigned by the Administration, take responsibility, in conjunction with the School's advancement office, for conducting fund raising activities. This includes capital campaigns tied to building(s) and grounds. An overall role would be to ensure all fundraising is aligned and centralized plans are developed. In addition, this committee will monitor all enrollment management and marketing efforts. The President/Chairperson shall recommend the chair of the Advancement Committee annually. - Bylaws for Catholic Elementary Schools - Diocese of Charleston

Our Advancement & Enrollment Committee actively works with our Parent Teacher Organization (PTO) in providing opportunities for families to come together to build a stronger school community. In addition, they provide insight as parishioners, donors, and friends of the school to provide advice and feedback on concerns that may hinder or promote enrollment. Some recent enrollment conversation has been centered around the following...

- Transparency to Catholic families wishing to enroll about the need to still be connected with their Parish Religious Education Program for Sacramental Preparation as this is not offered at SAP School
- How do we promote enrollment to St. Anthony parishioners when we have a large non-Catholic school population?
- How does the parish community view the school as a tool for evangelization?

Since we have a parish/school development office, much of that task is taken off the Advancement & Enrollment Committee, allowing them to focus on those events that directly impact the students, parents, and school staff.
