### **SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO**

#### **ACTIVE PARISHIONER**

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

-Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**)
-Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
-Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (**Treasure**)

#### PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

#### **Infant Baptism Class for Parents**

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre-registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

#### **First Holy Communion**

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

#### Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

#### Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

#### Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

### SPIRITUAL LIFE

#### FROM THE DESK OF OUR PRIEST IN RESIDENCE Fr. Emerson Rodriguez Delgado

Dear friends, today we gather to celebrate the Ascension of the Lord. It is a moment to contemplate Jesus' return to the Father who sent Him to reveal God's visible face and establish His kingdom as a home for all of us.

During this celebration, we ponder what prevents us from finding our true spiritual home. Each one of us is on a journey to uncover our True Self and discover our true home. This journey is not a straightforward path, but rather a spiral, driven by a deep longing within us—a longing that only God's love and companionship can truly fulfill. This profound longing reflects our spiritual desires-our yearning for a deep connection, the assurance of being part of God's greater family, and a sense of profound love and belonging.

Unfortunately, on this journey, we often encounter obstacles that hinder our progress. What internal barriers, such as harmful habits, crippling fears, and self-limiting beliefs, can divert us from our intended path?

The Ascension of Jesus also serves as a reminder of the pain of separation. Whether bidding farewell to a loved one or grappling with loss, this pain resonates deeply within each of us. Jesus' ascension does not mean His isolation from us. Instead, it signifies a new, transcendent relationship that goes beyond physical boundaries. He blesses us with the Holy Spirit, empowering us to continue His mission and bear witness to the infinite blessings of God's kingdom.

Finally, Heaven is not a specific location on a map. Instead, we may envision it as diving into an infinite ocean of God's love and dwelling there forever. We will truly come to know God, experience His presence, and bask in His love. God's love will envelop us and never let us go.

Let us, my friends, embrace the promise of Jesus' eternal presence and continue His mission of love and service in our community of St Anthony. May the indwelling presence of the Spirit always bring you peace and joy in your lives. Amen.
