SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO

ACTIVE PARISHIONER

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

 -Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**)
-Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
-Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (**Treasure**)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre-registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

SPIRITUAL LIFE

FROM THE DESK OF OUR ADMINISTRATOR Fr. Emerson Rodriguez Delgado

In this Sunday's Gospel from Mark, we encounter the story of Jesus and His disciples facing a fierce storm while on a boat. The storm rages around them, and their fear grows until they wake Jesus. At this critical moment, Jesus asks, "Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith?" This question invites us to reflect on our own lives. What "storms" challenge our faith and the unity of our community here at St. Anthony? How do we turn to Jesus to alleviate our fears and work towards unity and resilience?

This narrative is significant not only in our community, where discord and distrust can sometimes prevail, but also resonates throughout history and our ongoing struggles for justice, including the importance of Juneteenth.

Jesus identifies the disciples' fear as a lack of faith. Despite witnessing Jesus perform miracles, the disciples still struggle with doubt and vulnerability during a crisis. However, Jesus calming the storm is a powerful metaphor, showing that faith can overcome fear. It reassures us that even when God's help seems absent or silent, it is always there.

Turning our focus to Juneteenth, a day commemorating the emancipation of enslaved African Americans, we see a testament to the unwavering resilience, faith, and hope. Despite enduring unimaginable hardships, their faith and cause served as a beacon during their darkest hours.

The struggle for justice and equality continues. Acts of violence rooted in racism persist, and we may feel that our individual efforts are small. However, every action, no matter how small, contributes to the broader struggle for justice.

Reflecting on the lasting impact of slavery and our ongoing progress towards social justice, we are reminded of our collective responsibility to create a more just world.

As we commemorate Juneteenth, let us honor those who battled for freedom and justice, and let us commit to establishing a world that cherishes equity, compassion, inclusivity, and fraternity. With these lessons in our hearts, fueled by courage and guided by faith and love, we recognize that storms and crises will arise. But with steadfast faith and perseverance, we can discover peace and comfort amid these challenges, just as Jesus did on that stormy sea, and just as the champions of Juneteenth did.

May the grace of God, my friends, strengthen us in our journey of faith, and may the spirit of Juneteenth inspire us to work towards a world where every person is treated with dignity and respect.




