

# **SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO**

#### **ACTIVE PARISHIONER**

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

-Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**)
-Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
-Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (**Treasure**)

#### PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

#### **Infant Baptism Class for Parents**

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre-registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

#### **First Holy Communion**

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

#### Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

#### Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

#### Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

# SPIRITUAL LIFE

### FROM THE DESK OF OUR ADMINISTRATOR Fr. Emerson Rodriguez Delgado

This Sunday, we are captivated by the stories of two women who were miraculously healed by Jesus' touch. One is a girl who was brought back from the brink of death, while the other is a woman whose story is embedded within this narrative. She is slowly dying, her condition leaving her socially dead according to Mosaic law, even as she endures a slow, physical death.

Jesus' healing does more than just restore their physical health; it crucially reintegrates them into the community and reinstates their dignity as human beings. Unfortunately, many people we encounter are disconnected from their families, friends, our community and faith. This is the real life-or-death situation we face. Hence, the question arises: are we compassionate enough to act and invite those who are spiritually dormant or dying—or even dead—back to Christ and into the fellowship of his Church?

In essence, these stories resonate with a profound truth: faith has the power to heal and restore. "Do not be afraid; just have faith." Can we internalize Jesus' words today? After all, God is the ultimate lover of life.

Picture a young girl on the verge of womanhood, wrestling with the impending shadow of death, standing next to a woman burdened by twelve long years of chronic suffering. These stories go beyond mere miraculous healing; they delve into the profound depths of faith in adversity. So, where do we anchor our faith when faced with overwhelming challenges? How can we incorporate such steadfast faith into our daily lives and our community?

The story of the woman with hemorrhages illuminates the hidden wounds that plague our society. Her enduring struggle reflects the ongoing challenges faced by those marginalized due to socioeconomic status, race, gender, sexual orientation, disability, and mental health issues. How do we, as a community, react to such deep wounds? Are we active healers or passive observers in this situation?

Remarkably, when this woman, driven by what might have seemed like her last ray of hope, reaches out to touch Jesus' garment, we witness a silent yet potent act of faith. Jesus' acknowledgment of her faith as the catalyst for her healing emphasizes a powerful message: faith is not just a source of personal comfort but a transformative force capable of restoring life and its dignity. Indeed, faith, when expressed through justice and compassion, becomes a healing force.

These stories challenge us to examine the dynamics of our society and church, often tainted by exclusion, marginalization, and division. They prompt us to consider the roles we play in either dismantling or perpetuating these barriers. How can we foster a more inclusive and empathetic community that mirrors the compassion and acceptance and restoration demonstrated by Jesus?

Our mission, dear friends, is to evolve into the best versions of ourselves, reflecting the image of Jesus, our goal and model for becoming a true and perfect image of humanity. How will we respond to this call? May the healing touch of Jesus mend us and bring our community at St. Anthony closer together, as we stand as part of God's true family. 


