

SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO

ACTIVE PARISHIONER

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

-Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**) -Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**) -Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (**Treasure**)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Preregistration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

SPIRITUAL LIFE

FROM THE DESK OF OUR ADMINISTRATOR Fr. Emerson Rodriguez Delgado

This Sunday, the Gospel story recounts Jesus' encounter with rejection in his own hometown, among those who believed they understood him more than anyone else. Questions such as, "Who does he think he is?" and "Does he consider himself superior to us?" surfaced. This scenario paints a portrait of a society deeply rooted in distrust, myopia, rejection, intolerance, and criticism, echoing George Bernard Shaw's assertion that "all society is based upon intolerance." Could this be a reflection of our own society and church as well, especially during presidential elections?

Throughout history, there are numerous instances where genuinely good people were scorned by those closest to them. Familiarity can sometimes obscure the truth and seal us off from unexpected revelations from God in ourselves and others. Jesus' presence evoked nothing but astonishment among his people. His message about the nearness of the Kingdom of God and the need for a new mindset was met with deep skepticism. They clung to the belief that the ordinary couldn't possibly encompass the extraordinary. How capable are we of recognizing God in the ordinary, in the daily routines of our lives?

Brendan Byrne reflects on this, stating: "The episode illustrates that the greatest adversary of faith can often be 'familiarity,' a refusal to acknowledge that God's presence and His prophetic servants could be as close as the person next door."

The reality of the Incarnation startles us because God comes so close that we're obliged to respond directly and personally, stripped of the security of rituals, creeds, and philosophies.

Mark warns us that Jesus could specifically be rejected by those who believe they understand him the most— those who box themselves within their preconceived beliefs, declining to embrace the newness of his message or the mystery of his risen presence in the Eucharist, in the community, and in the poor. Which of Christ's teachings do you find to be the most challenging to accept and share?

Another aspect to consider is that welcoming Jesus as a prophet implies readiness to heed the message he conveys on God's behalf. This could pose challenges. As Christians, our perceptions of Jesus vary. Each of us cultivates a unique image of him, which shapes how we live our faith. If our image of Jesus is flawed, incomplete, or distorted, our faith mirrors these imperfections.

Today's Scriptures remind us that God's ways aren't always what we anticipate, and that God offers us more than we are prepared to accept. God's proximity frequently manifests in the familiarity and routine of daily life. Yet, this very familiarity surprises us as it calls us to recognize the incarnational potential in our own current time and place. As Paul taught, God chooses to work with and through human frailty. Let's rejoice in this truth. Wishing you a blessed week ahead.


