

# **SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO**

## **ACTIVE PARISHIONER**

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

-Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**) -Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**) -Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (**Treasure**)

#### PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for **at least six months** prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

#### Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Preregistration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

#### **First Holy Communion**

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

#### Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

#### Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

#### Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

## SPIRITUAL LIFE

#### FROM THE DESK OF OUR ADMINISTRATOR Fr. Emerson Rodriguez Delgado

Dear friends, have you ever felt like a hamster on a wheel, running endlessly but getting nowhere? In our world today, we're often trapped in a cycle of productivity, measuring our worth by our output. But is this really what life is about?

In today's Gospel, we see Jesus looking at the crowds with compassion. He sees them as "sheep without a shepherd." If we look around us today, don't we see the same thing? People who are lost, looking for direction, searching for meaning?

Think about it. Why do so many people go crazy over sports? Why are there so many addictions in our communities? Why are there so many groups trying to divide us? These aren't just random problems. They show that people are hungry for something deeper - for connection, for purpose, for someone to guide them.

These issues challenge us to change our approach. We need to transform ourselves and our interactions with others. As Gandhi said, "Be the change you wish to see in the world." Today's message is calling us to be the shepherds that our world really needs.

But here's the tricky part - how can we help others if we're exhausted ourselves? Jesus gives us the answer: "Come away by yourselves to a quiet place and rest a while." We need what Pope Francis calls an "ecology of the heart" - a balance of rest, contemplation, and compassion.

This summer, let's embrace this opportunity for renewal and recharging. Let's cultivate a contemplative outlook, so we can act without the constant need to acquire or consume in our throwaway culture. Let's stay connected to God, and not numb the deepest parts of who we are.

Remember, true fulfillment doesn't come from ceaseless activity. It comes from opening ourselves to God's love and sharing that love with others. As we leave today, let's ponder this challenge: How can we be good shepherds for the lost, offer rest to the weary, bring kindness to the hurting, and share God's peace with everyone we meet?

Are you ready to be the shepherd our world needs? This isn't about perfection, but about presence. It's not about having all the answers, but about being willing to walk alongside others in their questions. May God bless us and give us strength for this vital mission. Amen.
