SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO

ACTIVE PARISHIONER

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

-Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**)
-Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
-Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (**Treasure**)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre-registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

SPIRITUAL LIFE

FROM THE DESK OF OUR ADMINISTRATOR Fr. Emerson Rodriquez Delgado

A question from John's Gospel challenges us to look beyond our physical hunger: "Where shall we buy bread to satisfy the hungry?" Our bodies need food, but our souls crave something more - love, mercy, forgiveness, companionship, peace, and fulfillment.

When Jesus fed the multitude, He did more than fill empty stomachs. This miraculous act was a sign for His greater mission of caring for humanity's deepest needs. In the Eucharist, we find the culmination of this care -"real food" that nourishes our very souls with God's own

C.S. Lewis wisely warned against treating prayer as merely a way of asking God for things, comparing it to "using the stairs of heaven as a shortcut to the pharmacy." Our greatest need is not for God's gifts, but for God, the Giver Himself.

For the early Church, the Eucharist was more than a remembrance of Christ's sacrifice. It was an "anticipated experience of the fraternity of the kingdom."

Today, this sacred meal calls us to nurture communion and fraternity among ourselves, a reflection of the kingdom to come. The Eucharist challenges us to share what we have, even if it seems as insignificant as "five loaves and two fish." It compels us to examine our relationships, for as Luis González-Carvajal reminds us, "When fraternity is lacking, the Eucharist is superfluous."

We often get caught up in rituals and forget the true purpose of the Eucharist - to unite us and inspire us to seek unity. When we ignore injustice, lack solidarity, or fail to share in the suffering of others, the Eucharist loses its meaning.

The bread we receive nourishes us for love, not selfishness, urging us towards greater communication and solidarity.

St. Augustine taught, "If we receive the Eucharist worthily, we become what we receive" - self-giving love, mirroring Christ's sacrifice. This transformation propels us into mission, answering Pope Francis' call to become "missionary disciples" and "Spirit-filled evangelizers."

At the end of the day, the Eucharist makes us responsible for one another and for all whose hungers physical and spiritual - remain unsatisfied. When another hungers, it is our duty to provide. And once physical needs are met, we are called to satisfy the deeper hunger for Jesus, the true Bread of Life.

As we partake in this divine meal, my dear friends, may we become living bread for the world, extending Christ's love and nourishment to all we encounter. For in sharing this Bread, we are promised not just temporary satisfaction, but life eternal.


