SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO

ACTIVE PARISHIONER

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

-Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**)
-Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
-Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving
(**Treasure**)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre-registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

SPIRITUAL LIFE

FROM THE DESK OF OUR ADMINISTRATOR Fr. Emerson Rodriguez Delgado

Happy Sunday, my dear friends! As we navigate the complexities of life, let's pause for a moment and consider: What are you feeding your soul? You know, I was scrolling through my social media the other day, and it hit me - isn't it funny how we treat our spiritual lives like our Instagram or Facebook feed? A quick prayer here, a church check-in there, and we think we're set. But let me ask you this: Would you nourish your body with nothing but 'likes' and comments? Of course not! So why do we think our souls can thrive on spiritual fast food?

In John's Gospel, Jesus doesn't call himself the "Instagram of Life" No, He says, "I am the Bread of Life." Bread is what keeps us alive. Is Jesus just a nice idea in your life, or is He your daily sustenance?

St. Augustine said, "We become what we eat." Chew on that for a moment. Are you filling up on the junk food of negativity, division, and drama? Or are you feasting on God's goodness and love? The menu is yours to choose, but remember - it's shaping who you're becoming.

Think about how you approach communion. Are you drive-thru dining with God, or are you savoring a feast that transforms you from the inside out? Because, it's not just a ritual; it's a profound and transforming encounter with the living Christ.

Remember Elijah? The prophet was ready to quit, and what did God do? He didn't send a motivational meme; He sent a meal. Sometimes, our weary souls don't need another sermon; they need real, tangible, and compassionate grace. How is God nourishing you in your moments of weakness?

Even more, the Psalmist says, "Taste and see that the Lord is good." Faith isn't a bland obligation; it's meant to be a satisfying feast. So, as you come to the Lord's table today, ask yourself: Am I ready for more than spiritual fast food? Am I willing to let Jesus nourish not just my soul, but my entire life?

Because here's the truth: We become what we consume - physically, mentally, and spiritually. It's a daily choice, a day in and day out decision to turn to the Bread of Life. It's also about becoming people who can bring more of God's love and light into a world starving for hope. That's the kind of life I want to live - one that's nourished by the Bread of Life and nourishes others in turn.

So, what about you? We are what we eat - spiritually and physically. Our soul's diet will shape not just our lives, but the world around us. So, what will you choose to feed your life today? Will you choose love, forgiveness, and compassion, or will you choose bitterness, anger, and complaints? The choice is yours. Choose wisely. Have a blessed week filled with the bread of joy and compassion.




