

SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO

ACTIVE PARISHIONER

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

-Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**)
-Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
-Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving
(**Treasure**)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre-registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

SPIRITUAL LIFE

FROM THE DESK OF OUR ADMINISTRATOR Fr. Emerson Rodriguez Delgado

My friends, have you ever felt like giving up on your faith? Like the struggles in your life, including those within your church community, are simply too much to bear? You're not alone. In those moments, it's tempting to think that walking away from your faith would be the easiest solution.

But before you make any decisions, remember that you're at a crossroads. One path may seem easy, but the other path - sticking with your imperfect church family - is where the real growth and transformation happen.

The apostle Peter was once at a similar crossroads. When Jesus asked him if he wanted to leave, Peter replied, "Lord, where would we go? You have the words of eternal life." These simple words hold a powerful truth: only Christ has the key to eternal life.

Now, I know our church is far from perfect, and that's okay. It's not meant to be an exclusive club for the saints and the elite. Instead, it's a sanctuary for the broken, the lost, the sinners, and the seekers. It's a place where you can find guidance, a sense of belonging, and spiritual nourishment. Yes, there will be challenges and obstacles along the way, but at its very core, the church remains the body of Christ - your pathway to eternal life.

When doubts and disappointments creep in, whispering for you to give up, pause and ask yourself: "Where else can I find eternal truth?" The response is clear—there's no other option than Christ. He and He alone offers the promise of eternal life. If you choose to walk away from your faith, it's like cutting off your spiritual oxygen supply. You'll find yourself wandering aimlessly, thirsting for something real and substantial in a barren wasteland. But, my friend, you don't have to take that path. You have the power to choose to stay, to be the change you wish to see in your community here at St. Anthony. Hold fast to the words of eternal life, like a lifeline amidst the chaos of this world.

I won't sugarcoat it - the journey won't always be a walk in the Unity Park, but by sticking it out, you'll draw closer to the "Holy One of God." And here's the beautiful truth: You're not alone on this wild faith journey. Christ is right there with you, guiding you with His words of eternal life.

So, let's draw strength from Peter's unwavering commitment and brave the storms together. Let's work to make St Anthony faith community the beacons of hope and warmth they're meant to be. Because at the end, there's an incredible destination waiting - the very presence of God Himself. And that's an adventure worth sticking around for in community, even with all the bumps and bruises we may encounter along the way. Ouch!

Always remember that every step you take is part of a greater story, a beautiful tapestry woven together by God's loving hand. So keep your eyes wide open and your heart ready to receive. The best is yet to come, and that's the truth, the eternal truth, for real!

Each year 1 in 4 Americans over the age of 60 experiences a fall with various injuries. 


Are You Interested in becoming Catholic or learning more about the Catholic Faith?

NEWS FROM OUR SCHOOL

From the Desk of Our Interim Principal Mamie Boyd

Father Emerson officially opened our school year last Friday with prayer and a Commissioning and Going Forth Ceremony for the faculty and staff. The ceremony concluded with a blessing and the distribution of St. Anthony Key Chains from Fr. Emerson and Miracle Medallions (generously donated by the Superintendent of the Diocese of Charleston). The ceremony marked a beautiful start to our school year, deeply anchored in faith. Father Emerson engaged with the students, asking them questions about the Bible and their religious studies. We express our sincere gratitude to Father Emerson for honoring us with his presence and devoting his morning to our assembly.

This week signifies the first full week of classes, during which teachers are getting acquainted with their students and assessing their academic abilities. We are evaluating the necessary resources to support their educational journey.

The children thoroughly enjoyed our inaugural Mass with Father Emerson on Wednesday. He engaged them with his customary Bible quiz, which they answered eagerly. His innovative teaching method, involving props such as balloons, proved to be highly effective.

Several changes have been initiated at our school:

- Mass for our students will be held on Wednesday at 8:30 a.m., rather than the usual 11:00 a.m. time.
- · An armed security guard has been hired to enhance the safety of our campus community.
- The school drop-off line is located at the Douthit Street entrance, near the Gallivan Center, and is open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. Parents are required to use the Lindberg Avenue drop-off line after 8:00 a.m.

We extend our heartfelt gratitude to the parish community for your generous donations of back-to-school supplies. Your dedication of time, skills, and resources to St. Anthony of Padua Catholic School is deeply appreciated. We warmly invite you to visit our school for a personal tour. Keep in mind that there is a wide array of volunteer opportunities available, which include reading to children, assisting in the library, and supporting special events.
