SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO

ACTIVE PARISHIONER

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

-Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**)
-Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
-Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (**Treasure**)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre-registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

SPIRITUAL LIFE

FROM THE DESK OF OUR ADMINISTRATOR Fr. Emerson Rodriguez Delgado

Friends, the words of the apostle James hit us hard today, don't they: "Be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves." Ouch, that stings! It's easy to agree and say "Amen" to inspiring words, but are we truly living by them? Jesus warns that honoring Him with our lips while our hearts are far from Him is empty worship.

James challenges us: true religion isn't about going through the motions. It's getting our hands dirty, serving the overlooked and forgotten right here. It's being fully present, not physically here while mentally checked out.

How often do we catch ourselves scrolling through social media during gatherings with friends or family or even here in church, only to realize we've missed something important? Oops! We're missing the real moments, the chances to connect and love on each other.

Let's be honest, sometimes we get so busy that we fail to notice the pain around us. We tell ourselves we're too busy, but that's not the life Jesus wants for us. It's time to move beyond checklists and doing things mindlessly. We often rely on these checklists to feel righteous or the appearances of being a "good Christian – going to church, saying grace, or giving to charity. But Jesus saw through the Pharisees, who followed rules without any heart.

So, how do we reveal our true selves and stop being hypocrites (actors)? we focus on projecting perfect images looking for validation and acceptance, especially on social media. What if our church became a place where we could be honest and say "I'm a mess right now" and everyone would love us just the same. Because the truth is, Jesus sees our doubts, our fears, our flaws - and He loves us anyway. Unconditionally. Extravagantly.

That's the beauty of God's grace, friends. We don't have to perform or pretend. We can come to Jesus broken, and be embraced as His beloved.

Being that vulnerable, it's scary, I know. But it's the only path to true freedom and deeper connection with God and one another. Are we ready to let go of our masks and embrace authenticity?

Remember, it's not what we take in that corrupts us, but what comes out. Our words and actions and the way we treat others that's what shows our real heart condition. The insensitive comments, harsh judgments, indifference to suffering – these reveal what's going on inside us. If we're honest, we've all been guilty of those things at times. They show the junk still inside that needs work.

Here is the thing, none of us are perfect, but that's what makes us so lovable to God! Let's do this together, church family! let God's love shine through our authentic selves. Let's bring little more love, joy, and genuine connection and community - even in the grocery store line!

Dear St Anthony family, let's show the world true religion – not just attending church, but being the church, the living Body of Christ. Let's go be the church! "A field hospital" – messy, imperfect, full of grace and truth! And have fun while we're at it! Amen!

"A Matter of Balance"



Each year 1 in 4 Americans over the age of 60 experiences a fall with various injuries. Health Ministry and Bon Secours St. Frances have partnered to offer St Anthony's a program called "A Matter of Balance" to reduce falls. The program will be held for 8 weeks in the church lobby on Mondays from 1PM until 2:30PM starting September 16th. The program includes exercises to improve flexibility, strength, and balance. Participants also learn about home safety, reducing injury related to falls, recovery after a fall and various topics on fall prevention.
