

SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO

ACTIVE PARISHIONER

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

-Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**)
-Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
-Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (**Treasure**)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre-registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation


Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

SPIRITUAL LIFE

FROM THE DESK OF OUR ADMINISTRATOR Fr. Emerson Rodriguez Delgado

Who wants to suffer? Honestly, none of us. But the thing is, suffering is an unavoidable part of our human experience. It is like that annoying guest who shows up uninvited and forces us to deal with some heavy stuff about God's role in our struggles. But what if we've been looking at suffering all wrong? What if it's not just a dark cloud that follows us around, stealing our joy? What if, instead, this unexpected guest has the power to transform us and help us to discover profound meaning, unconditional love, and the chance to grow into our best selves?

Take a look at the crucifix. There, we witness Jesus, love incarnate, embracing the depths of agony with arms wide open and boundless love.

In our Sunday Gospel, we see Peter struggling to understand why Jesus decided to embrace all that suffering. Was it part of God's master plan? Was it our fault? Or was it the ultimate expression of a love that gives everything?

In Jesus, we see love and suffering tied together - a vulnerable, self-giving love that opens the door for God to meet us in our darkest moments. Yet, it's in those moments of darkness that God shows up, comforting us with the presence of the Holy Spirit, our constant companion and source of strength.

Now, I know it's easy to look around at all the suffering in this world and start questioning God's goodness. How can a loving God allow so much pain and suffering?

But when we look at Jesus on the cross, we find a powerful answer: God isn't just watching us suffer from a distance. He's right there with us, going through it all, turning our wounds into opportunities for growth, healing, and ultimately, redemption.

The image of Jesus on the cross, with Mary standing at the foot of it - it's like they're absorbing all the hate and darkness of the world and transforming it into hope and new life through the force of love.

This is the path that we are called to follow. It's not about simply enduring suffering; it's about embracing it as a catalyst for profound spiritual growth and transformation. It's a call to live with compassion, resilience, and an open heart – everything our fractured world is starving for.

And you know the secret weapon that unlocks this path? Gratitude. When we learn to see our suffering not as a curse, but as a blessing that can help us heal and grow, we begin to discover the hidden gifts and lessons that draw us closer to God.

So, my friends, let's face whatever comes our way with courage, knowing we are never, ever alone. Those hard times? They help us grow and become more like Christ. And in those moments, we have the chance to show real love and support for each other and truly experience the depths of God's love and mercy. Because it's often in the fire of suffering that we discover the incredible, life-changing power of His grace. And remember this: We are always surrounded by His grace, if only we have eyes to see. Shalom.


