# FROM THE DESK OF OUR ADMINISTRATOR Fr. Emerson Rodriguez Delgado

Epiphany Sunday, my friends. The story of the Magi following a star to find Jesus still speaks to us today. That star was like a divine GPS, leading them on an incredible journey of faith, courage, and transformation. And guess what? God still works the same way in our lives, using signs, people, events, questions, doubts, and even unexpected detours to guide us, reach us, and touch our hearts.

New year, new questions. Are you actively seeking God's presence in your life? Are you paying attention to the ways He might be working through those you meet and the situations you are in? Or are you like me when I lose my car keys and they're right there in my pocket? Life can feel chaotic, unpredictable, and messy. We hit roadblocks, take wrong turns, and sometimes wonder if we're even looking at the right map. But just as the star led the Magi through the darkest night, God's light continues to shine to guide us, if we are willing to follow.

The Magi's journey is about more than simply following a star. It's about the radical inclusivity of God's love. These men were outsiders—Gentiles from the East. The Epiphany reminds us that there are no outsiders in God's kingdom. His love has no limits. It shatters any boundary we try to put up. No matter who you are, where you've been, or what you've done. God is calling you into his embrace. Isn't that incredible news? As Henri Nouwen reminds us "God's love is greater than our greatest sin, greater than our deepest wounds, greater than our most painful memories."

However, we can't sit back and expect God to do all the work. The Magi embarked on a long, difficult journey, seeking Him with determination and perseverance. We, too, are called to do the same. Today, we have endless information at our fingertips – Google, Siri, Alexa – but none of it can satisfy the deepest longing of our hearts. Only faith can do that. Faith is the compass that helps us navigate through the unknown, the darkness, and doubts, and it leads us back to God.


St. Augustine knew this truth when he said: 'You have made us for Yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You.' That same restlessness drove the Magi across deserts and distant lands to find the Messiah. And it's the same restlessness—that hunger for meaning, for connection, for truth, for love—that should be driving us to seek Christ, too. But like the Magi, this requires something of us. It means taking a leap of faith, risks, and trust, even when the road ahead seems uncertain. As theologian Søren Kierkegaard wrote, "Faith sees best in the dark."

So, what does this mean for us? It means being open to the unexpected. God can show up in ordinary ways, places and people we don't expect. It might be in a kind word from a stranger, in a quiet moment of prayer, or a simple act of helping someone in need. Sometimes, it's in difficult and challenging moments of our lives. And when we meet Him, like the Magi, we can't go back the way we came. An encounter with Christ calls us to transform our hearts, priorities, and even our direction in life.

Let's be honest, though: this journey of transformation isn't always easy. The Magi's journey wasn't smooth, and neither ours. There will be times of doubt, fear, challenges, and failure. But we don't walk this road alone. Every time we gather as a community at St Anthony, we are like the Magi. We come seeking wisdom, guidance, and strength from Scripture, the sacraments and the community. And when we receive the Body and Blood of Christ, we are renewed, nourished, and transformed, for the journey ahead.

As we step into this new year, let's make it a time of seeking, discovering, and growing. Let's ask ourselves: What kind of journey am I on? And most importantly, am I willing to let the journey change me from the inside out? Let's be wise women and men, searching for the light of truth, love, and goodness wherever it may lead. And even when the road gets tough, let's keep moving forward in faith, knowing that God is always with us.

Finally, let's not stop at finding the light. Let's be the light. So, are you ready for the adventure? The journey of faith, transformation, and love? Then let's go out there and shine. Let's make God's love visible to all. Can I get an amen?

# **SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO**

### **ACTIVE PARISHIONER**

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

-Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**)
-Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
-Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving
(**Treasure**)

#### PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these

Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

### **Infant Baptism Class for Parents**

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

### **First Holy Communion**

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

### Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

### Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

### Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.




