SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO

ACTIVE PARISHIONER

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

-Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**)
-Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
-Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (**Treasure**)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre-registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

SPIRITUAL LIFE

FROM THE DESK OF OUR ADMINISTRATOR Fr. Emerson Rodriguez Delgado

Imagine Jesus standing in front of you, asking, "What would you like me to do for you?" It's like a genie offering to grant your biggest wish. What would you ask for?

In our world today, everyone seems consumed by the pursuit of being the best, gaining recognition, and beating others in our competitive, win-at-all-costs society. But Jesus offers a radically different perspective. He tells us, "If you want to be great, serve others." This idea goes against what we usually hear, doesn't it? It's not what we're used to at all.

Think about James and John in our Gospel passage. They were Jesus' closest companions. But even they got caught up in wanting to be important and powerful. This quest for self-promotion is a common human instinct, and Jesus knows it well. His message to them and to us is clear: "You think you're special? Try putting others first instead."

Our generation, and those to come, must learn the five timeless core messages of initiation that have been universally taught throughout the ages: Life is hard. You are not that important. You are not in control. You are going to die. Life is not about you; you are about life and about serving others.

At its core, Jesus' message is simple: put others before yourself. It sounds easy, but what does it really entail? When we think about it, we realize that truly serving others requires a profound transformation of who we are at our core.

When Jesus talks about "drinking from his cup," he is alluding to the fact that following him isn't always a comfortable path. It entails embracing discomfort, giving things up, and caring more about what others need than what we want. In a world that's all about comfort and getting what we want right away, this is a challenge ask. But Jesus isn't asking us to do anything he wouldn't do himself. He wants us to follow in his footsteps, to emulate his example. In God's kingdom, the last shall be first, and the greatest are those who humbly serve others. This is hard to do when everyone around us is trying to climb to the top and be better than others. But when we start to internalize this truth, we see the world differently.

As we go through our week, my friends, here is some food for thought: How can we reorient our focus toward serving others? What would it look like to embody servant leadership in our personal relationships, at work, or within our St. Anthony's fam? What fears or insecurities are hindering us from fully embracing a life of humility and self-sacrificing love?

So, I ask you, are you ready to embark on this transformative journey, to answer Jesus' unexpected and radical call to true greatness?
