SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO

ACTIVE PARISHIONER

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

-Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**)
-Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
-Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (**Treasure**)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre-registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

SPIRITUAL LIFE

FROM THE DESK OF OUR ADMINISTRATOR

My friends, it seems we're caught in a bit of a pickle, aren't we? Here we are, in the midst of a heated presidential election season that's splitting us apart like never before, and yet, we're talking about love. I know it might sound as out of place as a lamb in a lion's den. But, stick with me. Love is the very heartbeat of who we are, the beginning and end of everything that matters.

Jesus laid it down for us crystal clear - love God with all you've got! But how do we love God we can't even see? Here is the profound truth: by loving everything and everyone that God himself loves. This radical, selfless love is how Jesus himself lived. If we're serious about walking in his footsteps, we have to stay plugged into the Source of all love. As 1 Jn 4:7 says, "Whoever loves is born of God and knows God."

Just like in Jesus's day, we've been given that same command - love God with ALL our heart, soul, mind, and strength! But what does that mean for us now? Does love flow through your veins like a mighty river, or is just a faded bumper sticker on your spiritual car? We can't hide behind pretty words anymore, church - we need a faith that changes everything.

Listen closer, my friends! When we anchor our allegiance to God with every fiber of our being, we'll know how to truly live, choose, value, and yeah, even vote. I know it's no easy task, but through honest prayer, deep listening, boundless love, and wise choices, we can navigate these stormy waters with grace.

The Second greatest Commandment makes it practical: "Love your neighbor as yourself." As Teilhard de Chardin put it, "The way we treat people is the way we treat God." Every time we're kind, every time we put someone else first, every time we build a bridge instead of a wall - that's how we show our love for God.

But each day, we face a crucial choice: we're either feeding that selfish monster inside or cultivating a garden of compassion in our hearts. So, who can pull us out of this quicksand of apathy and self-centeredness that threaten to swallow our souls?

Only Jesus can. He showed us that loving God and loving others go hand in hand. C.S. Lewis wrote that true love isn't about getting what we want. It's about giving. It's about loving the hard to love people, even those who vote differently than we do. This is the love that Jesus embodied to the very end, the love that held Him to the cross, the love that beat death itself. As we find it in Jn 15:13: "Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends." This kind of love needs a response – it calls us

to love back, no matter what.

So, I ask you, do we truly love others as Jesus loved us? Do we care about them as much as ourselves? True love for others starts by loving ourselves as God does - unconditionally, extravagantly, without reservation. If not, how can we ever hope to love our

neighbors as Christ commanded?

It all boils down to love - a love that knows no boundaries or affiliations. When we focus on growing that kind of love, there's no room left for petty arguments or selfish thinking.

So rise up, church! This is our mission from God: love Him with every breath, love ourselves as God's beloved children, and love our neighbors as extensions of His heart. In these divided times, let us be lights of hope, shining with Christ's selfless, life-changing love. Only this kind love can heal our divisions and bring us back together.

Let's stand as one family in love, St Anthony. Can I get an amen? Let your voices shake these walls! Let heaven hear you! Amen!







