PASTORAL REFLECTION & WEEKLY OFFERTORY RECAP

FROM THE DESK OF OUR ADMINISTRATOR

On this third Sunday of Advent, my dear friends, we find ourselves scratching our heads, wondering: how could St. Paul, writing from a prison cell, speak so confidently about joy. As C.S. Lewis once noted, "Joy is the serious business of heaven" - and Paul embodies this perfectly. It's like finding a flower blooming in the desert. How is that even possible?

The secret lies in the paradoxical nature of Christian joy: it emerges in the most unexpected places - in a stable, fleeing to foreign countries, on the cross, in bearing with your spouse's flaws, and in countless other moments of trial and hardship.

Our world today? It's like having a Black Friday sale on happiness. Messages bombard us, telling us that acquiring more possessions, achieving status, or garnering more likes and followers will bring us joy. Christianity, however, offers a radical counterpoint. It's not about what we own; it's about Who owns us. Who we belong to. This shift in perspective changes everything.

Joy as a person to encounter, a relationship to embrace. This is what Christ offers us. In the Incarnation, God enters into our human experience, transforming it from the inside out. The joy of Christmas is not just a feeling, not Santa coming to town, or the gifts under the tree, but a Person - Emmanuel, God with us.

In our age of anxiety and despair, choosing joy becomes an act of spiritual resistance. When we rejoice despite circumstances, we declare our trust in a God who is greater than our struggles.

But how do we cultivate this deep joy? In our Gospel, John the Baptist gives us practical directions:

- Share what you have with those who have nothing.
- Conduct your business with integrity.
- Treat everyone like they matter (because they do).

In our often-cynical world, authentic Christian joy becomes a powerful testimony. When people see us maintaining joy in difficult circumstances, they encounter something that transcends human understanding.

As we journey through Advent toward Christmas, here some food for thought:

- Do we truly believe that joy is not just an option but a calling?
- If we took seriously the mandate to rejoice, how might our lives change?
- What prevents us from embracing the full joy God offers?


Dear friends, the invitation is clear: Come to the manger. Come to the cross. Come to the empty tomb. Come and encounter the living Christ, the source of all joy. For in Him, as St. Augustine reminds us, our restless hearts find their rest.

Our joy, as Thomas Merton might conclude, is not an escape from the world, but a profound engagement with its deepest mysteries. It is rooted in the all-encompassing presence of God, sustaining all things and drawing them toward their ultimate fulfillment in Christ.

Dare to be joyful, dear friends. Not because everything's perfect, but because God is present. Maranatha. Come, Lord Jesus, come. Who will you share your joy with today? Ok? Who else?

SACRAMENTS & MINISTRY INFO

ACTIVE PARISHIONER

The criteria for an Active Parishioner are:

-Weekly participation in worship through attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.

-Volunteer at St. Anthony's on regular basis (**Time**) -Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**) -Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (**Treasure**)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these

Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.
