BULLETIN CONTENT SUBMISSION

Anyone parish group/organization wishing to submit items for publishing in the weekly bulletin should send the content to Kyle Hall (<u>kyle.hall@charlestondiocese.org</u>) by end of day Tuesday for the coming weekend's bulletin. Submissions may have to be edited due to space constraints. Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony *must be registered members for at least six months* prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Preregistration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like

to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

PASTORAL REFLECTION & WEEKLY OFFERTORY RECAP

FROM THE DESK OF OUR ADMINISTRATOR Fr. Emerson Rodriguez Delgado

Friends, how often do we find ourselves scrolling endlessly, hoping to find clarity or answers in our screens? What are we searching for? The perfect meme? We live in a world that craves certainty. We want answers—fast, clear, and simple. Got a question? We Google it. Searching for the meaning of life? A five-minute TikTok might claim to explain it. Our lives are built on clarity, efficiency, and control. But this comes at a cost: it leaves little room for mystery and wonder. And let's be real, who needs wonder when you've got Wi-Fi, right? Yet, my friends, it's in mystery that God speaks. It's where the Holy Spirit moves. It's where we find meaning, purpose, and transformation. As people of faith—or seekers of truth— we aren't called to confine God to what we can comprehend or to limit reality to what we can see or measure. Instead, we're invited to trust in God's limitless possibilities—beyond logic or reason. Writer Annie Dillard once said that life is "covered with faint traces of mystery." These traces are everywhere, but they're easy to miss. Mystery whispers. It's woven in the small, everyday moments, waiting for those who are paying attention.

This Sunday's Gospel shows us this truth through Simeon and Anna. Their story teaches us about spiritual attentiveness. Guided by the Holy Spirit, Simeon arrives at the temple just as Mary and Joseph bring baby Jesus. Most people saw just another child, but Simeon saw the Messiah—the hope of salvation. Yet, his prophecy also carries a hard truth: Jesus will be a "sign of contradiction," forcing people to make a choice. Salvation is at hand, but it won't come without challenge. Nothing good, nothing lasting comes without a cost. Even Mary wasn't spared. Simeon warned her that a "sword" would pierce her soul—a hint of the pain she'd endure as she watched her son's crucifixion. Mary offered Him as the light of salvation to humanity. Simeon's message reminds us that salvation is both a gift and a

challenge. Faith isn't always comfortable. It takes courage to trust, follow, and let go of control, even when life feels messy or uncertain. What made Simeon different? His openness to the Spirit. His ability to see beyond the surface. While others rushed through rituals and motions, he was spiritually awake, ready to meet God in unexpected ways.

Then there's Anna. She spent decades worshiping and fasting in the temple. The moment she saw Jesus, she knew. She recognized Him as the Redeemer and shared this truth with others. Like Simeon, her faith allowed her to see what others missed. To Simeon and Anna the temple was not just a place of ritual. It was a space for encounter. Where is your temple? In the checkout line? The school drop-off? The hospital room?

In our fast-paced, hyper-connected world, it's harder than ever to simply be present. We're pulled in every direction - often stuck in the past (regrets, mistakes, resentments, addictions), anxious about the future, or glued to our phones and to-do lists. In all this noise, we risk missing the Spirit's quiet whispers.

But when we slow down and truly be present. We start to notice the faint traces of mystery God has woven into our lives and our community. We see Him in the ordinary—in sunlight through a window, a stranger's kindness, a child's laughter. We touch him in the struggles of the immigrant or the hardship of the homeless. We hear Him in the cry for justice and the suffering of the afflicted. Simeon and Anna remind us that faith isn't about having all the answers—it's about being open to the mystery of God's work in our lives. So, I ask you: Are you paying attention to where God might be whispering in your life? Are you open to the Spirit's leading, even when it feels uncertain or uncomfortable?

Faith, my friends, it's about surrender—about opening our eyes and hearts to the wonder of God's presence. This week, can you slow down? Can you look beyond the surface of your daily routines? Will you pay attention to the faint traces of mystery around you? And like Simeon and Anna, will you be ready to encounter Jesus—in the sacred temples of your own life, relationships, and everyday moments? Because He's there. Yes, even in the mess of your life. He is not hiding. He is waiting, whispering, moving. Salvation is knocking at your door. The question is: Are you present? Just open the door.

News From Our School



The program, "Behind the Scenes: Lights, Camera, Action, Film", organized by the Greenville (SC) Chapter of The Links, Incorporated, provided students with a series of four monthly activities, October 2024 to January 2025. The focus was on the tools and techniques of the film industry.

The program began with an introduction to the evolution of film technology, highlighted by a display of vintage cameras. 

Hospitality Ministry


