PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Active Parishoner

- Weekly attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.
- Volunteer on regular basis (**Time**)
- Active involvement in a parish ministry/organization (**Talent**)
- Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (**Treasure**)

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony *must be registered members for at least six months* prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility.

Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Preregistration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like

to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

PASTORAL REFLECTION

FROM THE DESK OF OUR ADMINISTRATOR Fr. Emerson Rodriguez Delgado

Real Joy: The radical call to unlearn happiness

What if everything you thought you knew about happiness was wrong? This Sunday, imagine Jesus looking straight into your eyes, gently yet boldly inviting you to reflect on the Beatitudes. These aren't merely comforting words or a set of rules. They are a radical call to discover true joy in our vocation as Christians. Are you ready to have your world turned upside down? Buckle up. Here we go: "Blessed are the poor." "Blessed are those who mourn." Blessed... when life is hard? It's unsettling, isn't it?

In this Sunday's Gospel from Luke, Jesus appears as the new Moses, descending from the mountain. But instead of stone tablets with laws, He offers a revolutionary new way to see and live life—one that challenges everything the world values. The world says: "Chase wealth." Jesus says: "Blessed are the poor." The world says: "Seek comfort." Jesus says: "Blessed are those who mourn." The world says: "Pursue power." Jesus says: "Blessed are the meek." It seems counterintuitive, right? But it's also completely liberating. Why? Because when we let go of what the world tells us we need, we open ourselves to God's transformative love and embrace our calling in Christ.

Now, this doesn't mean Jesus glorifies suffering or asks us to seek out pain. No masochism here, please. Instead, He calls us to live selflessly, love generously, and choose compassion over ambition. Think of saints like St Francis of Assisi and St. Theresa of Calcutta. They discovered perfect joy by serving others, especially the poor, the sick, the marginalized, the immigrant. Why? Because it brought them closer to Jesus - His suffering, His resurrection, and, ultimately, His promise of joy that nothing can shake.

The Beatitudes flip the script. The world says happiness comes from having it all. Jesus says it comes from giving it all away. Kenosis. That's the word. The Greek word for 'blessed,' Makarios, refers to a deep, unshakable joy—one that no hardship can take away. It's not about perfect circumstances but about being grounded in God's love and finding peace and strength, even in life's toughest moments.

So, what are we chasing? Wealth, power, comfort, social media likes? Or Jesus? When was the last time you felt truly fulfilled? Was it in receiving or in giving? Jesus is inviting us to a life of love and service. A life that leads us to a joy the world can't touch. As Pope Benedict XVI put it, the Beatitudes "reveal the character of Christ Himself and call us to embody His way of life—a life rooted in humility, love, and trust in God."

And here is the thing, the Beatitudes aren't just about the challenge. They are rooted in hope. Hope born from the resurrection. Without Jesus' triumph over death, these blessings would be empty promises. But because He rose, they remind us of the eternal joy awaiting us, not just here and now, but forever. Alleluia! So, does my faith in the Resurrection give me strength in trying times? What image do I hold onto when I feel like giving up?

The Beatitudes show us that happiness isn't a fleeting feeling. It's a choice. When we hunger for God, when we root ourselves in Him, we step into His blessings. Think of Mary, who sang of how God lifts the lowly and humbles the mighty. The Beatitudes echo her words, reminding us that God's kingdom turns everything upside down from the world's perspective.

Here is a reality check: If we trust in God, we gain the eternal happiness that only He can give. But if we cling to the world, we get ... well, the world, complete with its expiration date. Entropy. God takes our free will very seriously. Maybe we should, too, and examine our choices more carefully.

So, what is our next move? The Beatitudes are a call to action. In Aramaic, the word for "blessed," Yashar, means being on the right path, turning around when we stray, and moving forward. Today, as Jesus proclaims the Beatitudes, let's choose to live them. Live selflessly. Love boldly. Be faithful to the end. Discover that unshakable joy that leads to eternal life with God. Amen?

This week, let's go out and live a little more like Jesus. Let's see if we can find that real, lasting joy by focusing on others and trusting in God.

News From Our School




