

PARISH REGISTRATION & SACRAMENTS

ACTIVE PARISHONER

- Weekly attendance at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation.
- Volunteer on regular basis (Time)

- Weekly or monthly use of parish envelopes or online giving (**Treasure**)

PARISH REGISTRATION AND SACRAMENTS

Those seeking to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and Matrimony **must be registered members** for <u>at least six months</u> prior to reception of these Sacraments. You must be a registered member of the parish to ask for Godparent or Sponsor's form of eligibility. **To register, please email Kyle Hall at kyle.hall@charlestondiocese.org**, or you can also <u>register</u> <u>online</u> - scan the QR code below by opening your camera app.



Infant Baptism Class for Parents

Parents must be registered and active member of St. Anthony's. Class is offered on the third Thursday of every month. Pre- registration is required. Please call the office to pre-register. Baptisms are not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

First Holy Communion

Preparation begins in the first grade and continues into second grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week in August.

Confirmation

Preparation begins in the eighth grade and continues into ninth grade for a total of two years of preparation. Registration for Religious Education classes takes place in August. The first day of class is the third or fourth week of August. Adults who have not been confirmed and would like to receive the Sacrament are asked to contact the parish office.

Marriage

You must be registered and active member at least six months prior to preparation of the Sacrament. Couples should call the parish office and speak to the priest/ Deacon for pre-nuptial inquiries. Then the couple will begin formal marriage preparations at least six months prior to the wedding date.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

This is a process through which non-baptized adults known as catechumens or baptized adults who wish to convert from other faith traditions enter in communion with the Catholic Church. Classes begins in September. If you wish to become a Catholic, please call the parish office.

PRAYER

FROM THE DESK OF OUR PASTORAL ADMINISTRATOR

Have you ever stopped to ask yourself why Jesus' life had to end the way it did? Why the cross—such a brutal, violent instrument—became the central symbol of our faith? Why not a dove, a crown, or a more triumphant image? These lead us straight to the heart of the mystery of the cross.

The cross confronts us with life's hardest realities—suffering, pain, injustice, and even death. Yet it also stands as a radical symbol of hope, transformation, and unshakable love. It holds all these paradoxes in tension, a mystery that only God could orchestrate.

Let's start with the hardest part: the suffering. Jesus didn't just acknowledge the brokenness of this world; he fully entered into it. Betrayed by a friend. Abandoned by others. Nailed to a cross in the most agonizing way imaginable. He embraced the depths of human pain. God, through Jesus, did not stay distant from our pain. He stepped right into the mess.

Think about that. The cross reveals a God who doesn't shy away from life's hardships. He doesn't turn his face from our tears. And in times like these—when our country and our hearts feel unsettled—God meets us in the midst of it all. Jesus' suffering wasn't about punishment or wrath. It was about love. A love so deep, so sacrificial, that it chose to enter the darkest places of life and whisper, "You are not alone."

Have you ever felt like nobody sees you? Ever cried out in desperation, "Where are you, God?" The cross answers: God is right there, in the middle of it. Jesus himself cried out, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" His cry echoes your pain. His cry carries your heartbreak. The cross reminds us that God hears our cries, understands our pain, and walks with us through every fear, doubt, and suffering. Hallelujah!

But here's the beauty of the cross: it's not just about suffering. No, it's about transformation. Jesus took the very worst the world could throw at him betrayal, hatred, violence, and death—and turned it into love, redemption, and victory. If God can take something as horrific as the cross and make it beautiful, what does that say about the pain in your life? What might He be transforming in your life right now?

As a community, can we believe in that transformation? Can we trust God to take the wounds of hatred, division, and fear and turn them into something greater? What would it look like for us as a community to let God turn our brokenness into love, compassion, and unity? The cross doesn't just challenge us to see transformation. It calls us to believe that even in the darkest nights, healing is possible. Redemption is possible. Transformation is possible. Unity is possible.

And it doesn't stop there. The cross calls us to respond. It's an invitation to live differently. When Jesus said, "Take up your cross and follow me," he wasn't promising comfort or ease. He was calling us to a life defined by love—a love that forgives, sacrifices, and transforms.

So, let me ask you: what does the cross mean for you today? Is there someone you need to forgive? A fear, hatred, or anger you need to let go of? A burden you need to place in God's hands, even though you don't have all the answers? Just surrender.

This Holy Week, take time to sit with the cross. Let it remind us of God's deep, unfailing love—a love that doesn't avoid pain but redeems it. Let it reassure us that no matter how dark life seems, the story isn't over. Love still wins. Hope still stands. New life is always possible.

So whatever cross you're carrying today, remember this: God is with you in it. He's not distant. He's right there, walking beside you, turning pain into purpose and despair into hope. The cross isn't just a reminder of suffering—it's a promise. A promise that God's love is stronger than fear, stronger than pain, stronger than anything you're facing today. And that, my friends, is a promise worth holding on to. Amen!
